

"I promise you, in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the first Friday for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance; they shall not die in my disgrace nor without receiving the sacraments; my divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in that last moment." — Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary

How to complete the First Friday's Devotion:

- 1. Receive Holy Communion on each First Friday;
- 2. The nine Fridays must be consecutive;
- 3. They must be made in honor and in reparation to His Sacred Heart.

FIRST SATURDAY OCTOBER 3RD ANNOINTING OF THE SICK DURING 8:30AM MASS

First Saturday Devotion

The Essential Elements of Devotion-With the intention of making reparation to the Immaculate Heart, we are asked to:

- 1. Go to confession (Can be within 8 days before or after the First Saturday)
- 2. Receive Holy Communion (If there is no Saturday Mass or due to the COVID pandemic, one can offer a Spiritual Communion, see below)
- 3. Pray five decades of the Rosary
- 4. Keep Our Lady company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary

The Great Promise-Our Lady promised to assist all those who will practice the devotion of the first Saturday on **five consecutive months** with the graces necessary for salvation at the hour of their death.

*BOTH DEVOTIONS ARE BEAUTIFUL, ONGOING ACTS OF REPARATION (NOT JUST FOR THE 9 OR 5)

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

For the past several weeks, the word of God has drawn us into the mystery of mercy. Today's readings deepen our reflection, reminding us how blessed we are to know God's kindness and sharing practical ways to show compassion to others. The prophet Ezekiel cautions God's chosen people, emphasizing that bad behavior naturally leads to painful conse-The psalm responds quences. prayerfully: "Remember your mercies, O Lord." In this prayer, we ask for the mercy of recognizing our sins and receiving the strength to act differently. In his letter to the Philippians, Saint Paul invites us into a daunting challenge of mercy: "humbly regard others as more important than yourselves." If we scoff at Paul's challenge as impossibly naïve, the Gospel gives us a chance to reconsider. Our natural instincts of selfpreservation might reject merciful behavior initially, but like the son in today's Gospel of mercy, we can change our minds.
